THE SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY

Glenelg High School is a public high school that serves approximately 1185 students in grades 9-12. Located in western Howard County, it is one of twelve high schools in the Howard County Public School System. The community is experiencing rapid growth, transitioning from a rural area to a suburban one. Many families in the school community commute to the Baltimore or Washington areas to work in professional or semi-professional careers.

POST SECONDARY PLANS

93% of the 2008 graduating class attended a post secondary institution (69% - 4 year, 24% - 2 year); 7% entered the military or job market.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT COURSES:

AP SCHOLARS PROGRAM:

Students who will complete a minimum of six AP courses by the end of the senior year, including a math, a science, a social studies, English Language & Composition or English Literature & Composition, and at least two additional AP courses.

GRADING SCALE. A=90-100, B=80-89, C=70-79, D=60-69, E=59-below.

Grades are reported on a nine-week, quarterly basis. The final year-end grade is determined by averaging the four quarterly grades (20% each) and mid-year and final exams (10% each).

Advanced Placement, Gifted & Talented, and Honors courses are indicated on transcripts with an "AP, GT, or H".

CLASS RANK/GPA

The Howard County Public School System computes both weighted and unweighted Class Rank/Grade Point Average (GPA) for each senior. Both are determined on October 1 of the senior year and include all courses completed at that time. The unweighted rank/GPA is computed by counting all courses equally on a four-point scale. The weighted rank/GPA is computed by weighting all Advanced Placement (AP), Gifted and Talented (GT) or Honors (H) courses in English, Science, Social Studies, Mathematics, and World Language in which a student earns an A, B, or C. In AP or GT courses, students with an A, B, or C will earn the weighted designation of 1.0 additional quality point(s). In Honors courses, students with an A, B, or C will earn the weighted designation of .5 additional quality point(s). Weighted and non-weighted class rank and GPA will both appear on the high school transcript.
