

**GLENELG HIGH SCHOOL COUNSELING CENTER
SCHOLARSHIP ALERT** **FEBRUARY 2010**

The Glenwood Lions Club is pleased to offer educational scholarships to graduating students enrolled at Glenelg High School and Marriott's Ridge High School. A total of four \$1,500 scholarships will be awarded. These scholarships are dedicated for the use of tuition, registration fees, housing, board, and fees related to enrollment for the freshman year at an accredited college, university, technical school or other post secondary institution. Criteria: 2010 graduate, U.S. Citizen, demonstration of academic performance, participation in school/community activities, community service and financial need. Applications are available in the counseling center. Criteria includes 3.0 GPA, a resume, an essay of no more than 500 words that covers education plans, career goals and aspirations, what impact this scholarship will have on your educational plans and career goals and a letter of recommendation. The Federal Water Quality Association is pleased to offer scholarships to young women and men preparing for careers in environmental protection. Seniors who are graduating from high school and will immediately attend a four-year undergraduate program leading to a bachelor’s degree and planning to pursue environmental careers in environmental sciences or engineering are eligible. Three to four scholarships in the amounts of \$2,000 will be awarded this year. This year the opportunity exists to extend the awarded scholarship for four years. Applications are available in the counseling center and must be received by April 19.

The final deadline to submit the online application is **May 1, 2010**. Once you complete the online application, you will be directed to a list of required supporting documentation. The supporting documents must be postmarked by **May 15, 2010**. Award decisions will be announced in late July.

In 2010-2011, they have roughly \$1 million in funding available through 28 different scholarships and through their interest-free loan program. The loans are **completely interest-free through the life of the loan**—you pay back exactly the amount you borrow. Also note that due to limited funding, loan awards are competitive. A student may receive up to \$10,000 per year in any combination of scholarships and loans. Each scholarship has slightly different eligibility requirements, but they all follow the same basic guidelines which are listed on the website. The sole exception is the [Stulman Endowed Scholars Program](#), which does not require students to be permanent Maryland residents. Specific details for each program can be found in the drop-down menus on our website. We offer scholarships for undergraduate and graduate study as well as for career training.
