Have a GPA of 2.75 and maintain a minimum overall GPA of 2.75 in college

Enroll and be accepted as a full time student each semester

SCHOLARSHIPS FOR CAREER TRAINING

The [Weinberg and France-Merrick Grant Programs for Career Training](#) offer scholarships to Maryland students seeking career training at private vocational schools. Schools and/or training programs must be approved by the Maryland Higher Education Commission and must lead to a marketable skill. **~Credits may not be transferable to any college or university.**

Preference will be given to residents of the Baltimore Metro area. ~CSB’s income guideline for this program is a family adjusted gross income of \$66,000 or less. Scholarships may fund as much as 75% of the cost of the program, up to a ceiling of \$6,000.
