The ACT is a national college admissions examination that consists of subject area tests in: English, Mathematics, Reading, Science, plus a Writing Section. The ACT registration cost is \$47.00 for the ACT Plus Writing exam. Registration includes up to 4 college score reports; each additional report is \$9.00.

ACT results are accepted by all 4-year colleges and universities in the U.S. For more information regarding the test, please contact your child's guidance counselor.

HOWARD COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOLS - JROTC REGISTRATION FOR FOR 2010/2011

December 7, 2009 is the opening date for students to request an interview with the JROTC Instructor and the School Administrator if the JROTC program is not offered at their geographically designated school and they are interested in enrolling in the program for the 2010/2011 school year. An interview is not a guarantee of acceptance in the program. **The final date to request an interview is Friday, January 22, 2010.** Requests for interviews for the JROTC program from students, who were enrolled in the Howard County Public School System during the open date for registration (December 7, 2009 – January 22, 2010), will NOT be accepted after January 22, 2010 unless the program is at risk for being eliminated due to low enrollment.
