

MLA BIBLIOGRAPHY FORMAT

BOOK

Author's name (Last, First). Title of Book. City of Publication: Publisher, Year.

Example:

Wilson, Frank. R. The Hand: How Its Use Shapes the Brain. New York: Pantheon, 1998.

A BOOK BY TWO AUTHORS

Eggs, Suzanne, and Diane Slade. Analyzing Casual Conversation. London: Cassell, 1997.

A BOOK BY THREE OR MORE AUTHORS

Marquet, James W. et. al. The Chair, the Table and the Door. Austin: University of Texas Press, 1987.

AN ARTICLE IN A REFERENCE BOOK (ENCYCLOPEDIA, ALMANAC, ETC.)

Author's name. "Article Title." Title of Reference Book. Edition. Copyright year.

Example:

Brown, Mark. "Wolves." World Book Encyclopedia. 2002 ed. 2001.

***** IF THERE IS NO AUTHOR, BEGIN WITH THE ARTICLE TITLE**

AN ARTICLE WITHOUT AN AUTHOR IN AN ONLINE DATABASE

"Title of Article." Database Title. Editor. Version. Date of Creation or Update. Your Date of access. <web address/URL>.

Example:

"Lady Freedom Among Us." Gale Student Research Center, Jr. Gale Group, 2001. 3 June 2002. <http://www.galegroup.com/st#3452/ladyfreedom.html>.

A WEB SITE

Author's Name (if given). Title of Site. Name of organization associated with site (if given). Date of access. <web address/URL>.

Examples:

Dawe, James. Jane Austen Page. 15 Sept. 1998. <http://nyquist.ee.ualberta.ca/austen.html>.

Romance Languages and Literatures Home Page. 1 Jan. 1999. Dept. of Romance Langs. 8 July 1999. <http://humanities.uchicago.edu/romance/>.
