HSAs

The HSAs are assessments designed by the Maryland Department of Education. The four assessments are Algebra 1, English 10, and Biology. Each assessment is taken at the end of the year in which the course was taken. For instance, most students will take the Algebra 1 assessment at the end of their 9th grade year. Some may take it at the end of their 8th grade or 10th grade year. The majority of students will take English 10, and Biology at the end of their 10th grade year.

During the year in the HSA course, preparation for the end of the year assessment takes place throughout the whole course. Quarterly assessments are provided to assess the knowledge and skill of each student.

For those unable to pass, HSA mastery classes are provided during summer school and during the school year.
