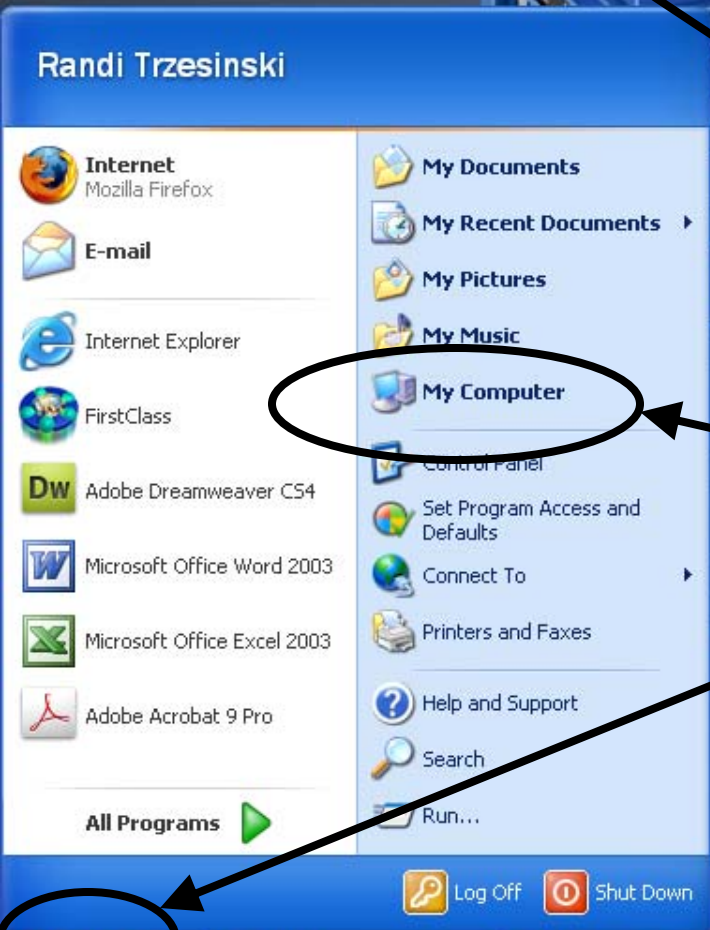
Begin by inserting your flash drive into the USB port on the side (or back) of your laptop. If using a desktop, you may also have a USB port in the front of your computer.)

Wait a few moments. A window like this should pop up.

Once you see this window, click Cancel.



Do **NOT** open or view anything. This could download a virus should one be living in your flash drive.



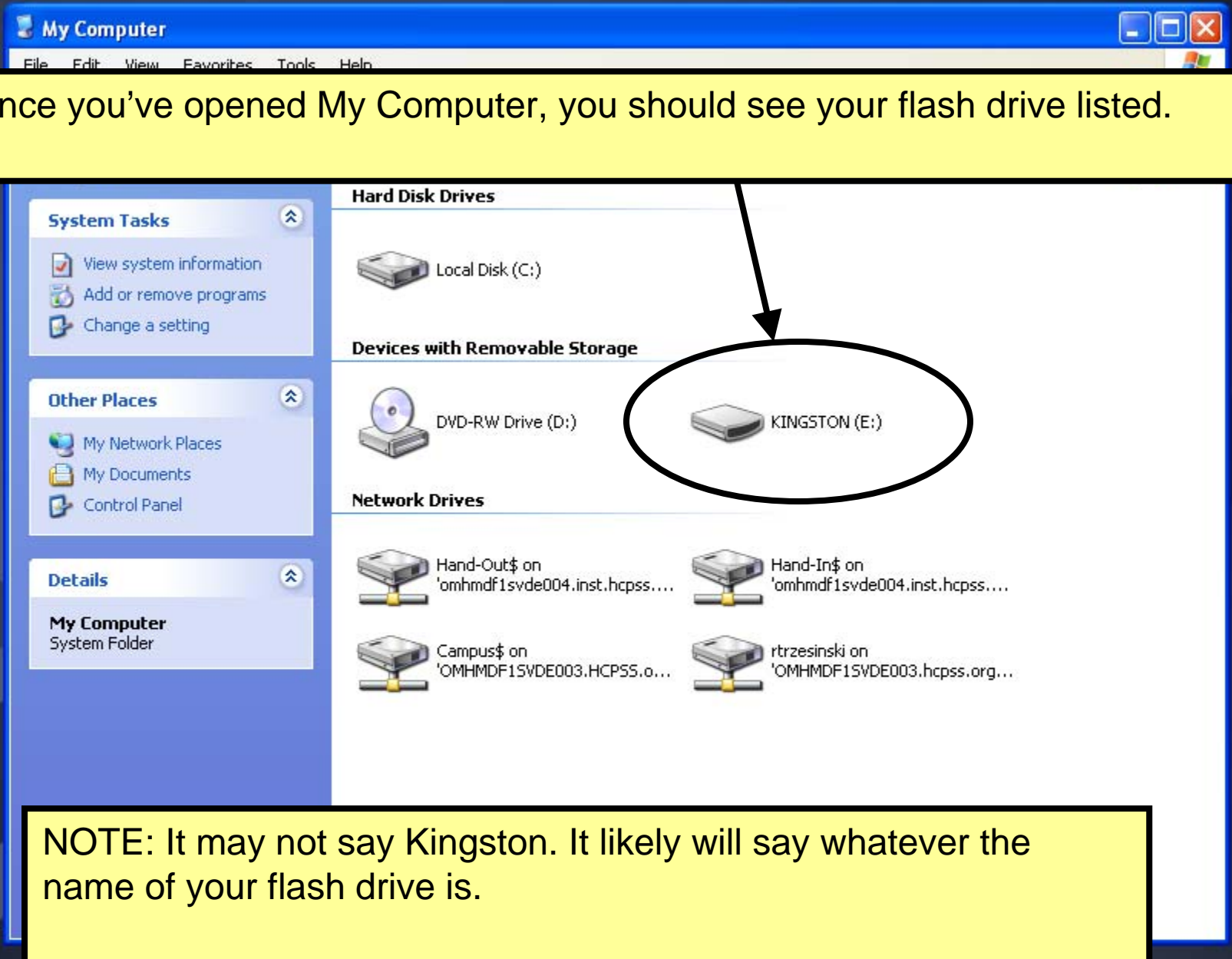
Open My Computer.

You can do this by either double-clicking on the icon on your desktop.

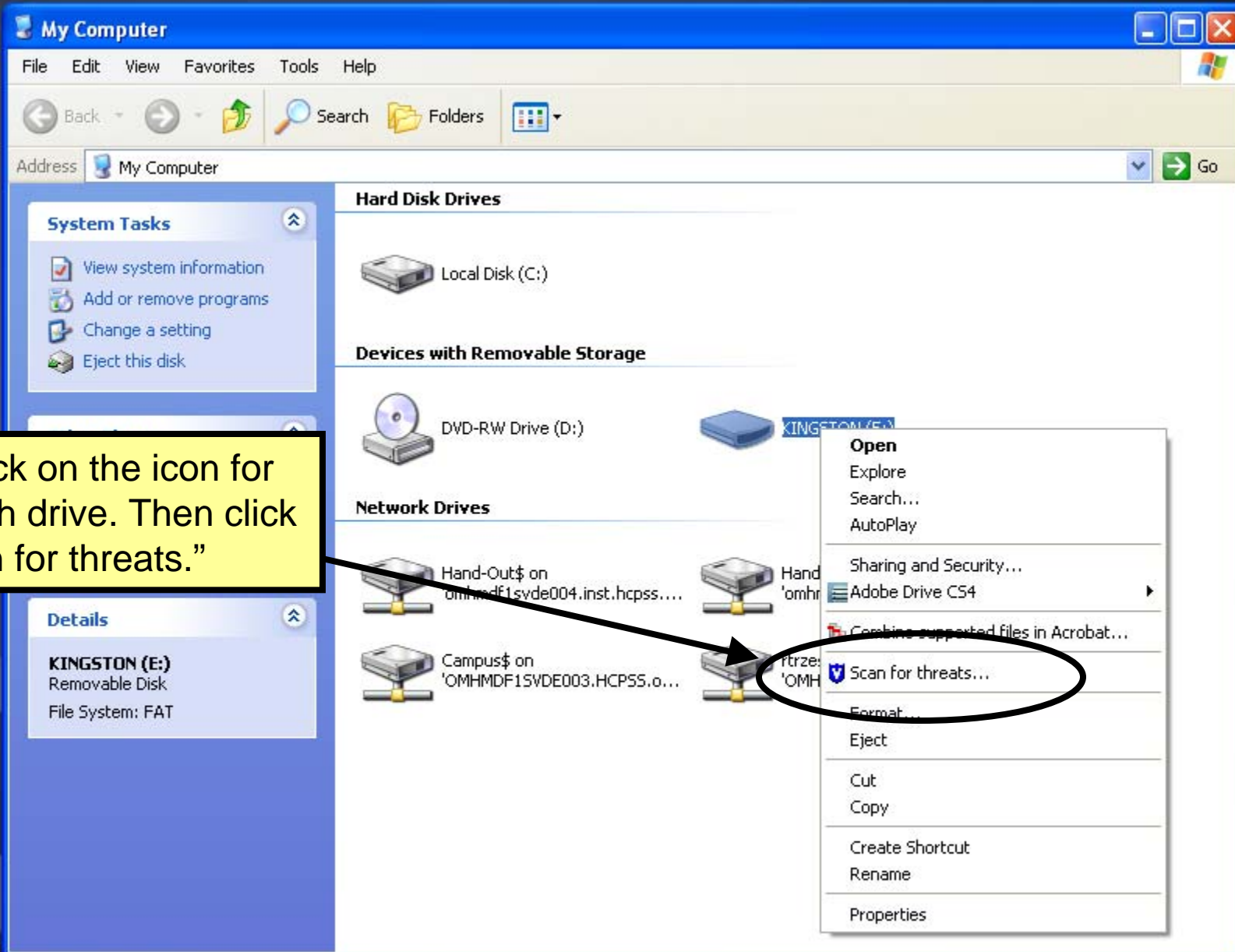
OR

Click on the Start menu, and then click on My Computer.

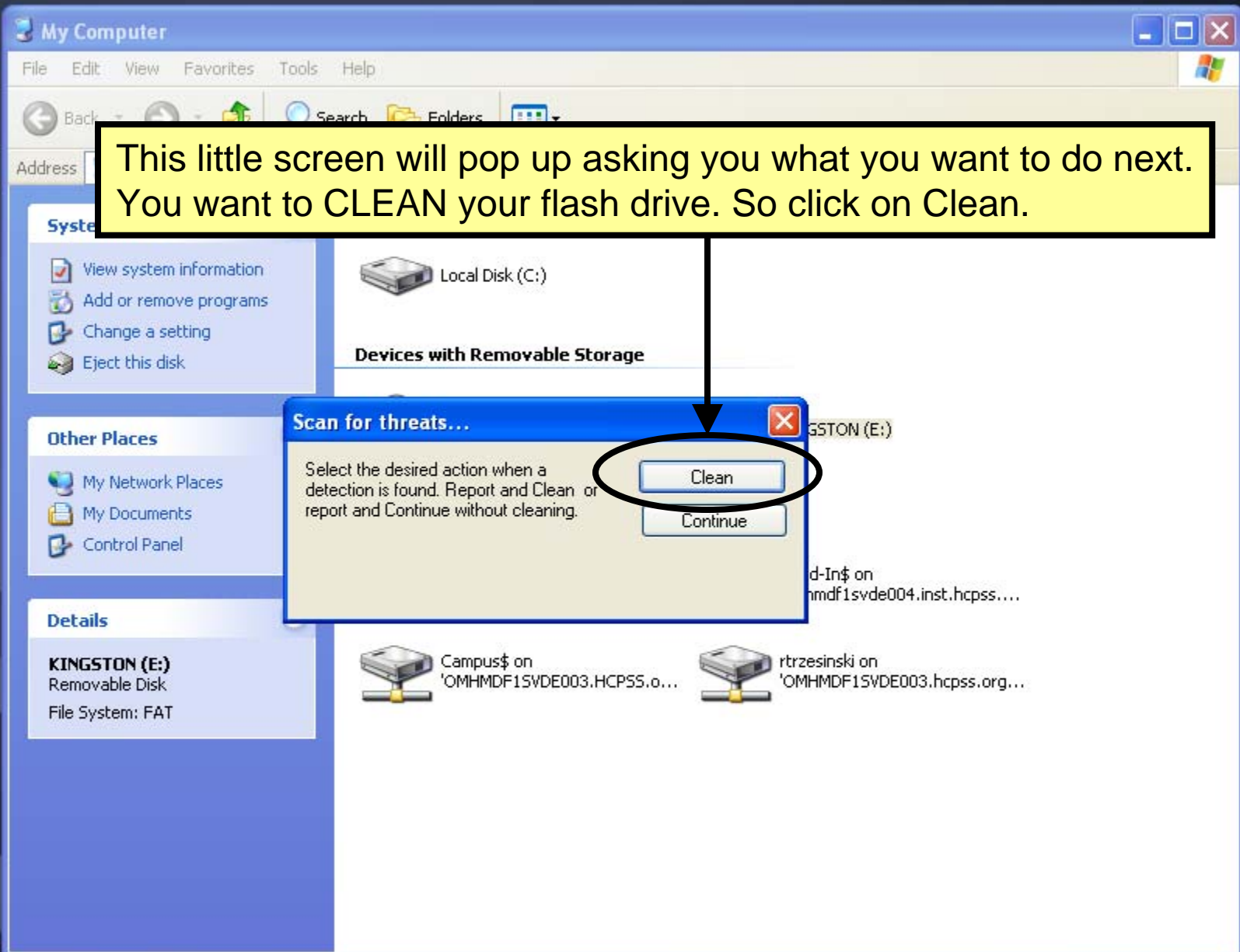
Once you've opened My Computer, you should see your flash drive listed.



NOTE: It may not say Kingston. It likely will say whatever the name of your flash drive is.



Right-click on the icon for your flash drive. Then click on "Scan for threats."

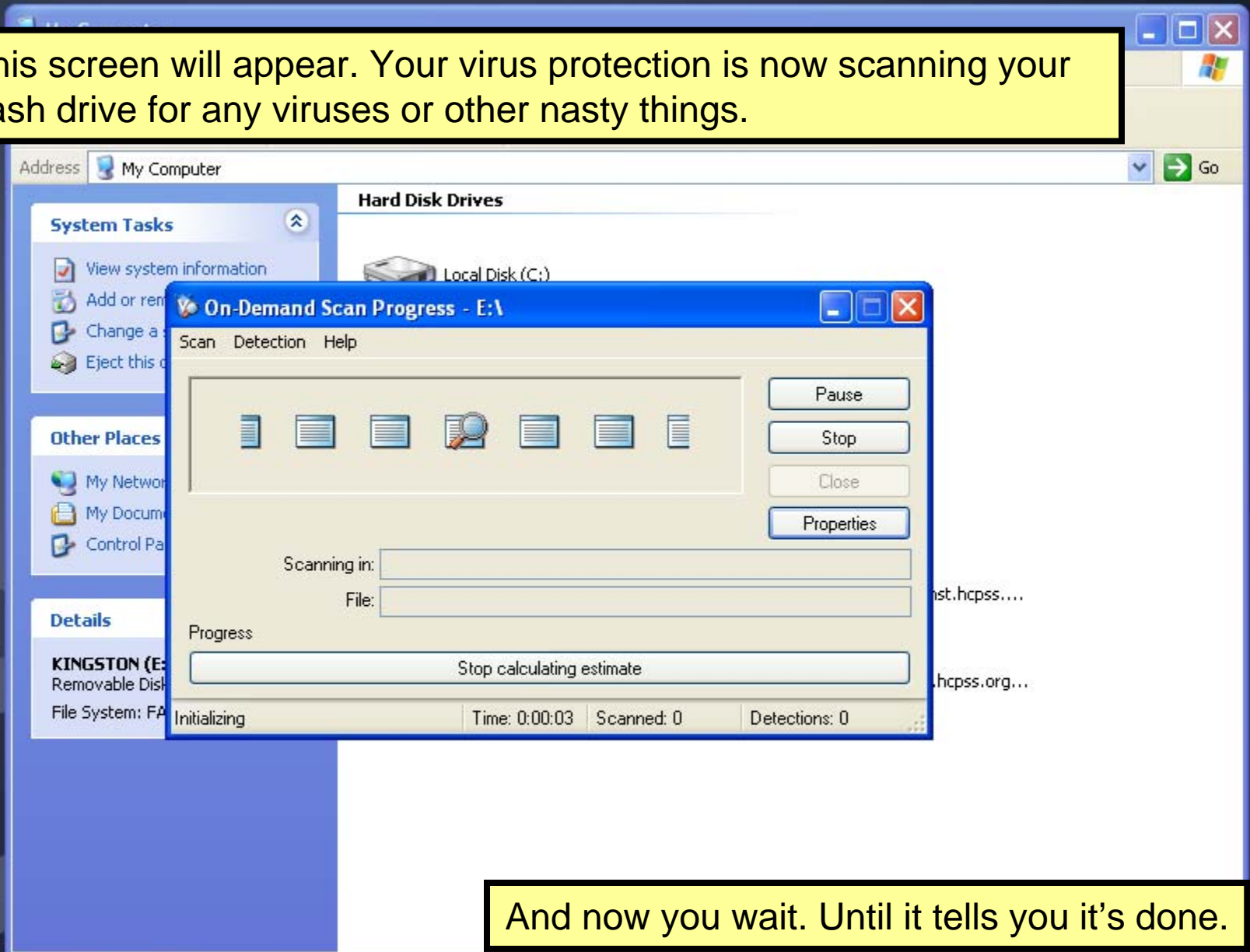


This little screen will pop up asking you what you want to do next. You want to CLEAN your flash drive. So click on Clean.

Scan for threats...

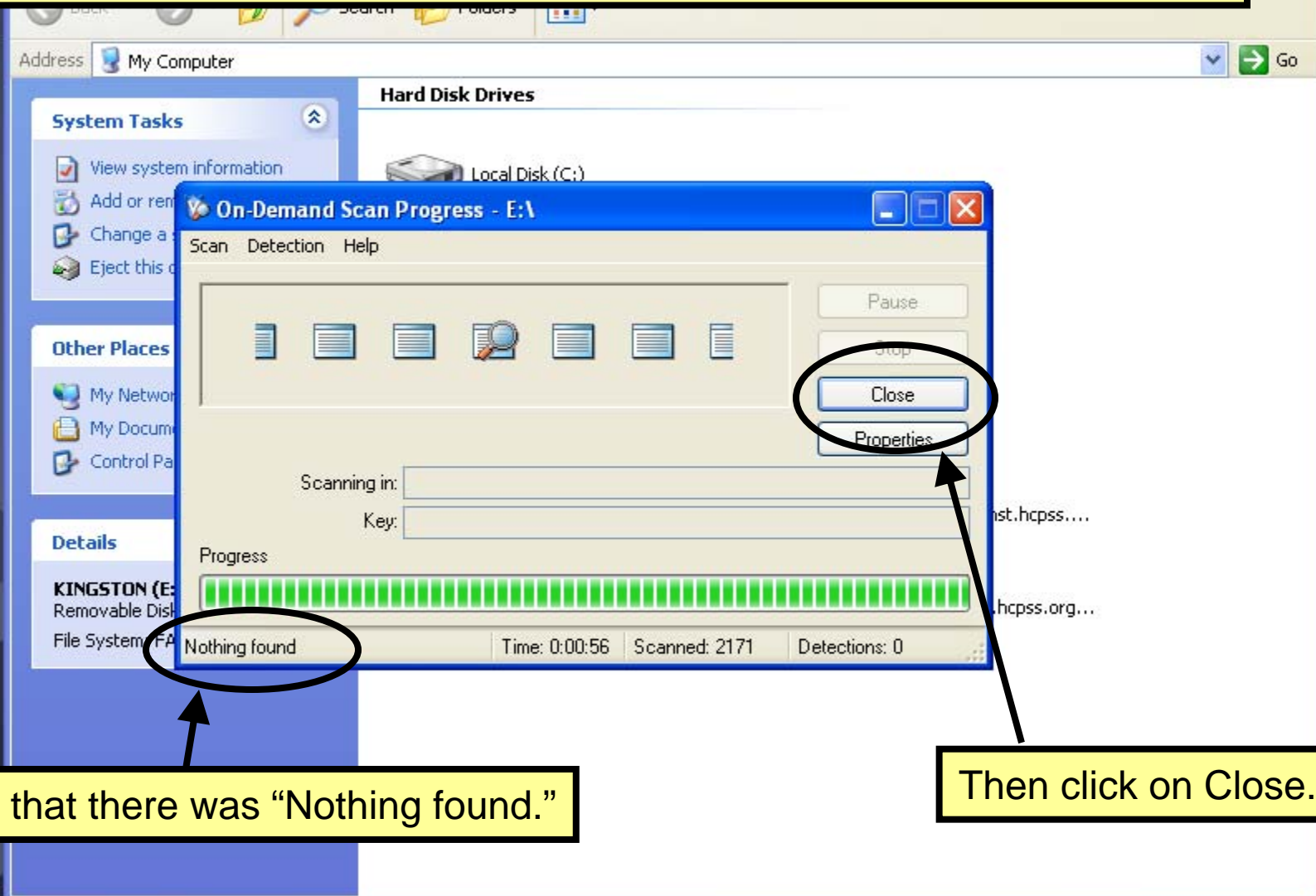
Select the desired action when a detection is found. Report and Clean or report and Continue without cleaning.

This screen will appear. Your virus protection is now scanning your flash drive for any viruses or other nasty things.



And now you wait. Until it tells you it's done.

Once the scan is complete, your little On-Demand Scan window should hopefully look like this.



Then click on Close.

Telling you that there was "Nothing found."

WAIT!!!!

What if something was found by the virus scan?

Well, hopefully there will be some kind of message that says the number of threats found, and that they were cleaned. (It may say that in the same spot where the "Nothing found" message is.)

If the virus wasn't cleaned, bring the flash drive and your laptop down to the Media Center and we'll take a look.

THAT'S ALL FOLKS!

Feel free to now open up your flash drive
and avail yourself of its contents.

Worry free. Cuz now you know that you're
virus free.
